Out of reach of US and UK anti-corruption laws?

An interactive discussion with Professor Andy Spalding

The jurisdictional provisions of the US Foreign Corrupt Practices Act and UK Bribery Act were each drafted to cast very wide extraterritorial nets. And those nets may now be expanding due to new enforcement policies. This talk will compare the original extraterritorial jurisdictional provisions of the two statutes, consider various criticisms of modern anti-bribery enforcement, and explore how new enforcement trends can now affect clients residing well beyond the US, including in CEE.

Andy Spalding is Professor at the University of Richmond School of Law, where he teaches and writes in the area of international anti-corruption law, and is a member of the Frequent Visiting Faculty at IACA. He is also Senior Editor of the FCPA Blog. His scholarship has appeared in the *UCLA Law Review*, *Washington University Law Review*, and many other academic venues, and has been covered by *The New York Times*, *The Wall Street Journal*, *The Economist*, *The Atlantic*, *Forbes*, and *National Public Radio*. Professor Spalding was previously a Fulbright Senior Research Scholar in Mumbai, India, and was the founding Chair of the American Society of International Law's Anti-Corruption Law Interest Group.
